They believed in the right of every child to an education regardless of their background, a tradition of inclusion that proudly continues today.

We ask parents to ensure that all items of clothing are labelled with your child's name so that lost items can be returned to their rightful owners.

Body piercing is not permitted apart from one pair of stud earrings in the earlobes (for health & safety reasons).

Homework

- As per school practice, homework is prescribed Monday to Thursday with occasional exceptions
- Weekends are usually homework free
- All pupils are expected to do homework. [Phased in gradually with junior infants]
- The class teacher, keeping in mind the ages and abilities of the pupils, determines the amount of homework prescribed to each child
- Reading, spelling and tables should be checked each evening by a parent/guardian
- Never complete homework for your child
- · Parents/Guardians will be notified in cases where homework is being neglected or incomplete
- If you find that your child is having continuous difficulty and becoming upset because of homework, please reach out to their teacher
- Parents/Guardians are asked to sign the homework diary for 1st to 6th classes each evening to ensure that the homework given is fully and neatly completed
- If your child is unable to complete homework assigned for any reason, please inform their class teacher who will be very helpful & understanding

Our Special Education Team

In C.B.S. Primary, Ennis, we are extremely fortunate to have a very dedicated, talented and professional Special Education Team.

Children are assessed regularly from 1st class onwards to establish their educational needs. Standardised assessments are carried out in Maths and English by their class teachers. Support will be provided for pupils who are most in need. Should your child require any special assistance, be it short term or long, a member of staff will contact you and invite you to the school to discuss your child's individual needs.

The school also has the services of an educational psychologist, who works closely with us in assessing children who might be experiencing difficulties in learning.

Further information on the provision of special education is published on the school website under "School Policies".

Autism Class

As part of our inclusive approach to education, we have an ASD class in the new academic year. It has a capacity for 6 children with Autistic Spectrum Disorder, who have a report recommending placement in an ASD class in a mainstream school. The class has been set up to provide those children with opportunities to integrate into mainstream at a pace that is optimal for their learning.

Out Of Hours Activities

At C.B.S. Primary, we partner with many clubs and organisations within our community to help provide a variety of opportunities for our pupils.

We have arrangements with many clubs in the locality who utilise our state of the art facilities here at C.B.S. Primary, Ennis.

Some of these clubs include Coder Dojo, Brownies, Speech & Drama classes, Chess Club, Irish dancing and many more.





Home/School Communication

In C.B.S. Primary, Ennis, communication between parents and the school is facilitated in the following ways:

- Individual consultation by appointment with the class teacher
- Parent/teacher meetings held annually in person or via telephone
- Written report cards
- Our school website www.cbsennis.com
- Data display information board located in the main school foyer
- Aladdin Connect Parents have the facility to connect with the school via our online home/school communication system. You will receive a connect code from the school which will allow you to log into the system via the Aladdin Schools App. (From the app you will be able to access your child's report cards, manage their absence reasons, receive notifications from your child's class teacher and from the school principal, make payments, respond to some notifications and much more.)



State of The Art Facilities

In September 2019, we were privileged to step foot into our new 4,530m² school building comprising of 24 classrooms, including a 2 classroom special needs unit and ancillary accommodation.

Our fantastic facilities include a 50m x 20m astroturf pitch, a full-length basketball court, a school hall, cooking facilities, an amphitheatre for outdoor learning, Promethean Activpanels in each room. All of our pupils from 4th to 6th class also have their own laptop.









Solar Panels

C.B.S. Primary, Ennis, is Ireland's first fully solar-powered school. In line with the E.R.S.T. charter, we want to provide ethical and environmentally conscious education. It is school policy to strive for carbon neutrality and solar power is just one step along that path.

A 50kw system, along with 50kw hours of battery storage, is installed. With a full set of data for 2023, we were able to confirm a production surplus. Every year, our school produces more electricity than it needs, with the excess being sent to the grid to power other local businesses and homes.









The Curriculum

The school curriculum is designed with the holistic development of our pupils in mind. It is bound by the requirements of the Department of Education & Science for Primary Schools.

In C.B.S. Primary, Ennis, our weekly timetable includes the following subjects:

Irish, English, Mathematics, Social, Environmental and Scientific Education (Geography, History, Science), Social, Personal and Health Education, Religious Education, Arts Education (Visual arts, Music, Drama) and Physical Education. We have a keen interest in Digital Literacy and STEAM based initiatives in our school also.







School Initiatives/Extra Curricular Activities

Aistear

The Early Childhood Curriculum Framework celebrates early childhood as a time of being, and of enjoying and learning from experiences as they unfold. [NCCA]

Aistear, meaning journey, is one of the many teaching and learning tools we use in C.B.S. Primary to explore and implement the primary school curriculum.

Aistear is an opportunity for your child to explore different types of play under different themes.

Building Bridges of Understanding

Building Bridges is a whole-school approach to the teaching of reading in C.B.S. Primary. From when your child starts with us in Junior Infants, they will begin to explore different strategies of comprehension. The aim of this is to enable your child to become a self-regulated, strategic reader.

Literacy Lift-Off

Literacy Lift-Off is a team approach, incorporating the use of stations to teach different areas of literacy. These include a writing station, a word work station, a new book station and a familiar reader station.

Activities at these stations may include:

- Re-reading familiar books to build fluency and confidence
- Being introduced to and attempting to read a new book
- Composing and recording their own messages
- Reconstructing the story which has been cut-up
- Exploring how letters/words work using magnetic letters and whiteboards
- Children take part in Literacy Lift-Off for one term per year in Senior Infants and 1st Class





Numicon

Numicon is an approach to teaching maths that helps your child to see connections between numbers. Later on, Numicon is also



sometimes used as an intervention programme to help children struggling with maths.

Active School Flag

The Active School Flag is a Department of Education and Skills Initiative supported by Healthy Ireland which aims to get more schools more active, more often. It is awarded to schools that strive to achieve a physically educated and physically active school community.

We have an Active School Committee made up of representatives from each class from 2nd to 6th who promote and organise fun activities for the whole school. Each year, the committee organises an Active School Week, the aim of the week is to promote physical activity and PE in both the school and wider community. During the week, children get taster classes in a variety of areas including Hip-Hop Dance, Golf, Tennis and



Yoga. Every day after small break, there is an activity burst where music is played in the yard and the whole school dance and perform exercises to the music. Each year, the whole school takes part in 'Walk a Mile with a Smile', where we walk a looped mile around the town of Ennis. The school's Junior and Senior Sports Days also take place during Active School Week and these always prove to be a huge success.

School Band

C.B.S. Primary has a school band which is directed under the genre of traditional irish music, but caters for all melody instruments. The band partakes in many public performances, including the annual school concerts, Féile na hÍnse, Christmas events and the annual Christmas appeal in the Square in Ennis. The band has members from 3rd to 6th class and the children rehearse weekly. It is a great chance for children to experience a wider-based curriculum.

STEAM Projects

5th and 6th classes regularly partake in STEAM activites and in-class competitions. The children learn to engage in Scientific, Technological, Engineering, Arts and Mathematical activities.

Intel Mini Scientist

C.B.S. Primary students compete in the Intel Mini-Scientist Competition each year. The Mini-Scientist Competition challenges children all over the world to express their creativity and participate in an amazing programme. The Mini-Scientist programme is for 4th to 6th class students and has many schools taking part each year. The competition aims to foster a love of science and creativity. This project is one of the many hands-on activities that C.B.S. Primary offers and is a wonderful experience for your child.











Badminton Club

An afterschool badminton club is available to students in 5th and 6th class who wish to improve their skills at the game.

It attracts a lot of pupils who enjoy the leisure aspect, as well as those who are more competitive.

We train once a week after school with teachers who have completed the Shuffle Time training courses leading the session. During training, students get an opportunity to improve their fitness levels as well as acquiring and enhancing their skills of the game


Throughout the year the school badminton team has an in-house blitz and competes with other schools in Co. Clare in badminton tournaments.

Green Schools Programme

Here at C.B.S. Primary, Ennis, we are delighted to be involved in the Green Schools programme. We are currently working on the theme of 'Biodiversity'; a term which refers to the huge variety of life that is all around us. Our overall aim is to increase awareness of the importance of biodiversity, and for students and staff to come up with ways to help biodiversity in our area. Our Green Schools committee play a vital role in achieving this goal. Each class from 3rd to 6th has a representative on the committee, attending meetings every fortnight, and reporting information back to their class.







We have been very busy this year working towards the green flag for Biodiversity. Firstly, we conducted an Awareness Survey, to establish what prior knowledge we had on the topic.
