The Erasmus Plan

- Objective 1 – Encourage students to think Globally about issues and relate them back to their daily lives
 - Ongoing
 - Complete introductory presentations
 - 3 online interactions per year
 - Complete a parallel project in one subject area
 - Co-presenting/cooperation on a project
 - Shared activities online
 - Completion/presentation of projects in person (mobility)
 - Immersion exchange programme



The Erasmus Plan (cont'd)

- Objective 2 – Encouraging more students into language learning and cultural exchange by removing barriers to participation
 - Ongoing
 - Increased participation by schools on both sides
 - Improved participation and attitudes to language learning in Ennis
 - Surveys of participating students at the start and end of each annual cycle



The Erasmus Plan (cont'd)

- Objective 3 – Exploring the role of the digital world in supporting global thinking
 - Ongoing with annual increments of progress
 - Co-constructed use of digital media (presentation/project work)
 - Start with video conferencing – expand its use
 - Shared digital workspaces
 - Remain open to innovations
 - Keep note of frequency, volume and variety of digital solutions used
 - Currently zoom (staff – 3-4 times a year), big blue button (classes – 5+ times a year)



The Erasmus Plan (cont'd)

- Objective 4 – Developing global, environmental awareness
 - Ongoing
 - Environmental consideration during decision making (take note)
 - Travel methods
 - Use of technology to reduce carbon footprint
 - Example of parallel project possibility
 - Any risk assessments will include an Environmental Risk category



Mobility opportunities

- 2025/26
 - Staff mobility
 - 12 (3 per school)
 - Meeting with other schools, shadowing, activities
 - Student mobility
 - Up to 30 primary, 60 secondary (+ 9 staff)
- 2026/27
 - Student mobility
 - Up to 80 primary, 80 secondary (+ 16 staff)
- Student trips don't necessarily need to be simultaneous
- Reciprocation may be required (paid out of their funding)



Some points to consider

- Erasmus quality standards
 - Basic principles of Erasmus
 - Diversity, environment, digital education, active participation
 - Management of mobility activities
 - Control, transparency, contributions, bring back to teachers' daily practice, get feedback, equitable allocation of tasks and funding, joint decision making, sharing expertise and resources
 - Quality supports to participants
 - Practical arrangements, H&S, regulations, fair selection of participants, prep or participants, monitoring and mentoring, support/supervision, learner outcomes, review outcomes
 - Sharing results/knowledge about the programme
 - Within participating schools, public, acknowledge EU funding publicly (keep note)



Management of the Plan

- Appoint a lead teacher
 - Each gets a vote on behalf of their school
 - Each handles their school's involvement
 - Reports on progress in their school
 - Relay agreed report back to their school
- Set dates for meetings
 - Online and in person (1-2 termly)
 - Engage with our German counterparts about mobility (+Bettie von Arnem Gesamtschule?)
- Agree rough timeline
- Apply for drawdown of funding by 11am, 19th of February for 2025/26
- Agree strategy for disseminating information
